Finnish higher education institutions and internationalisation

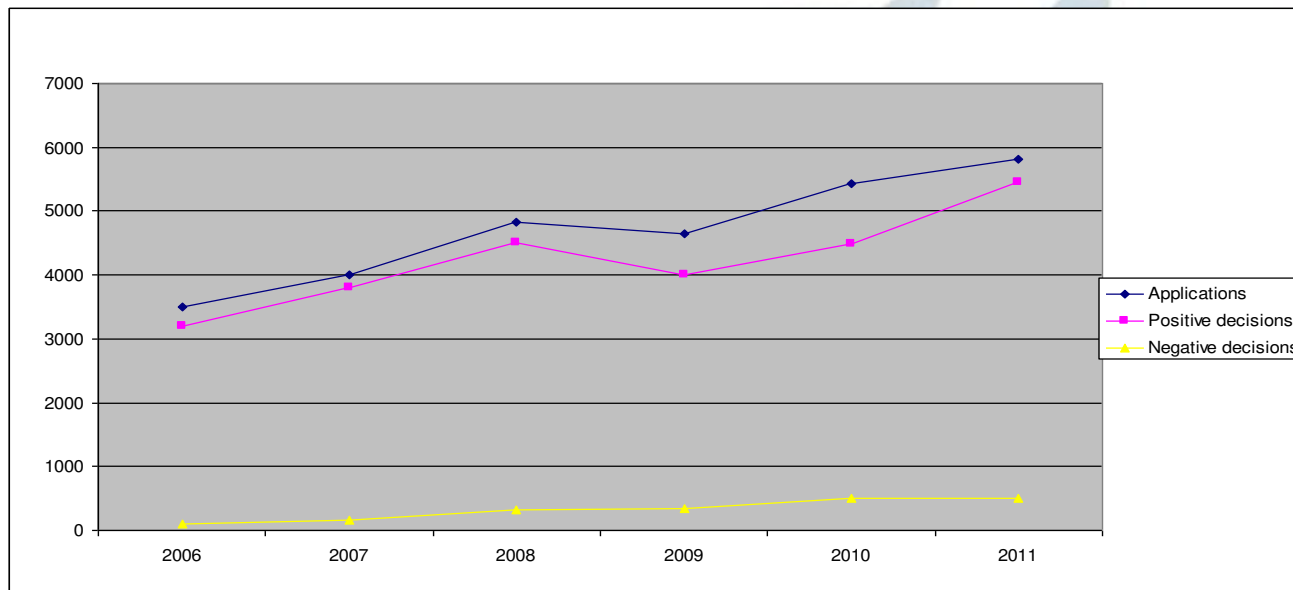
- Strategy for the Internationalisation of Higher Education Institutions in Finland for 2009 – 2015
- Number of degree students from third countries growing (year 2006: 7 400, year 2010: 11 724)
- Academic programmes in English
- Tuition fees on a trial basis



Residence permits on the ground of study 2006 – 2011

- Immigration policy changing
- Year 2006: 3 508 applications (91,1 % positive decisions)
- Year 2011: 5 806 applications (94 % positive decisions)

- Cooperation between HEI's and authorities



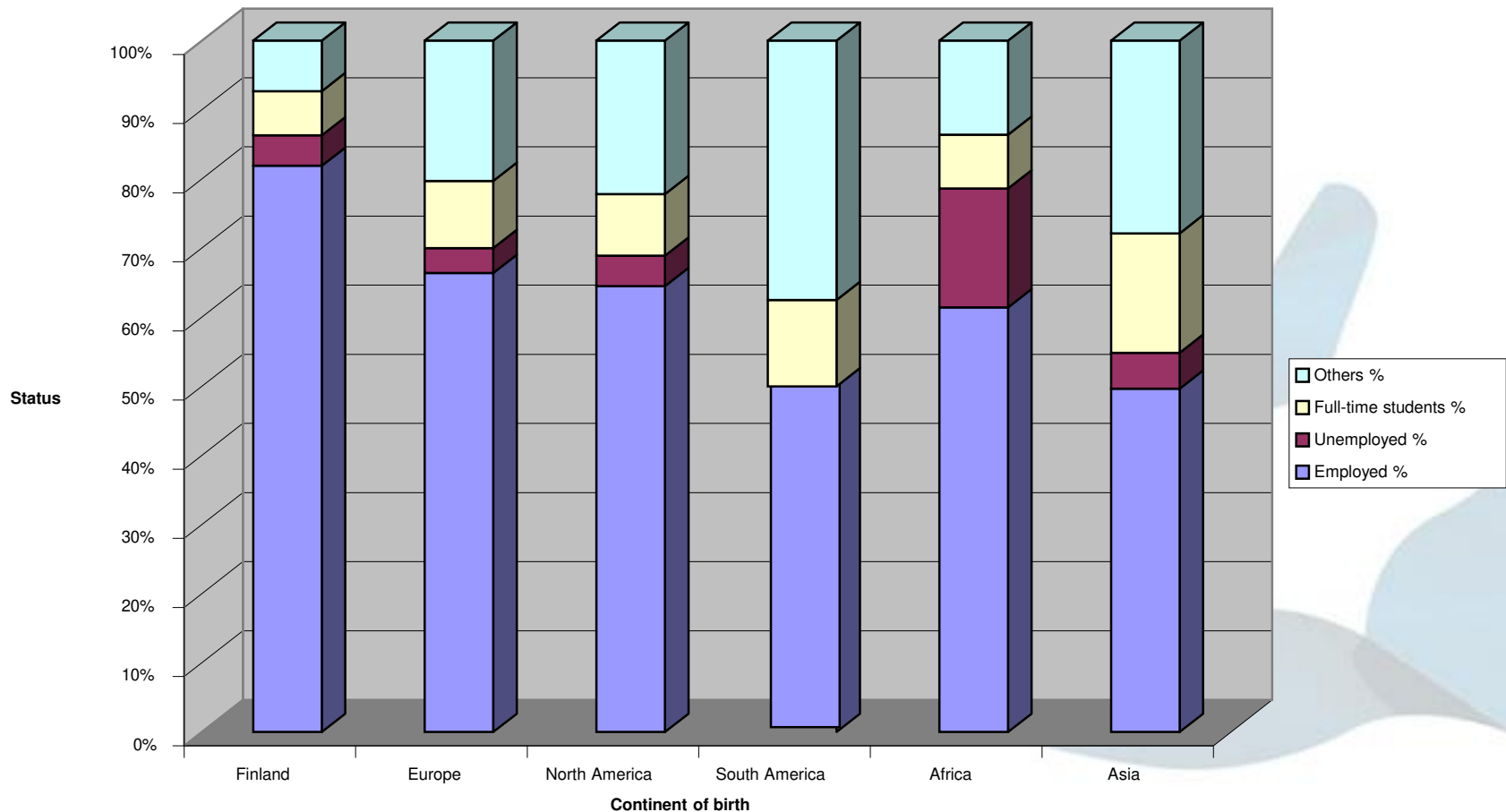

- Free education vs. satisfying the future need of the labour market



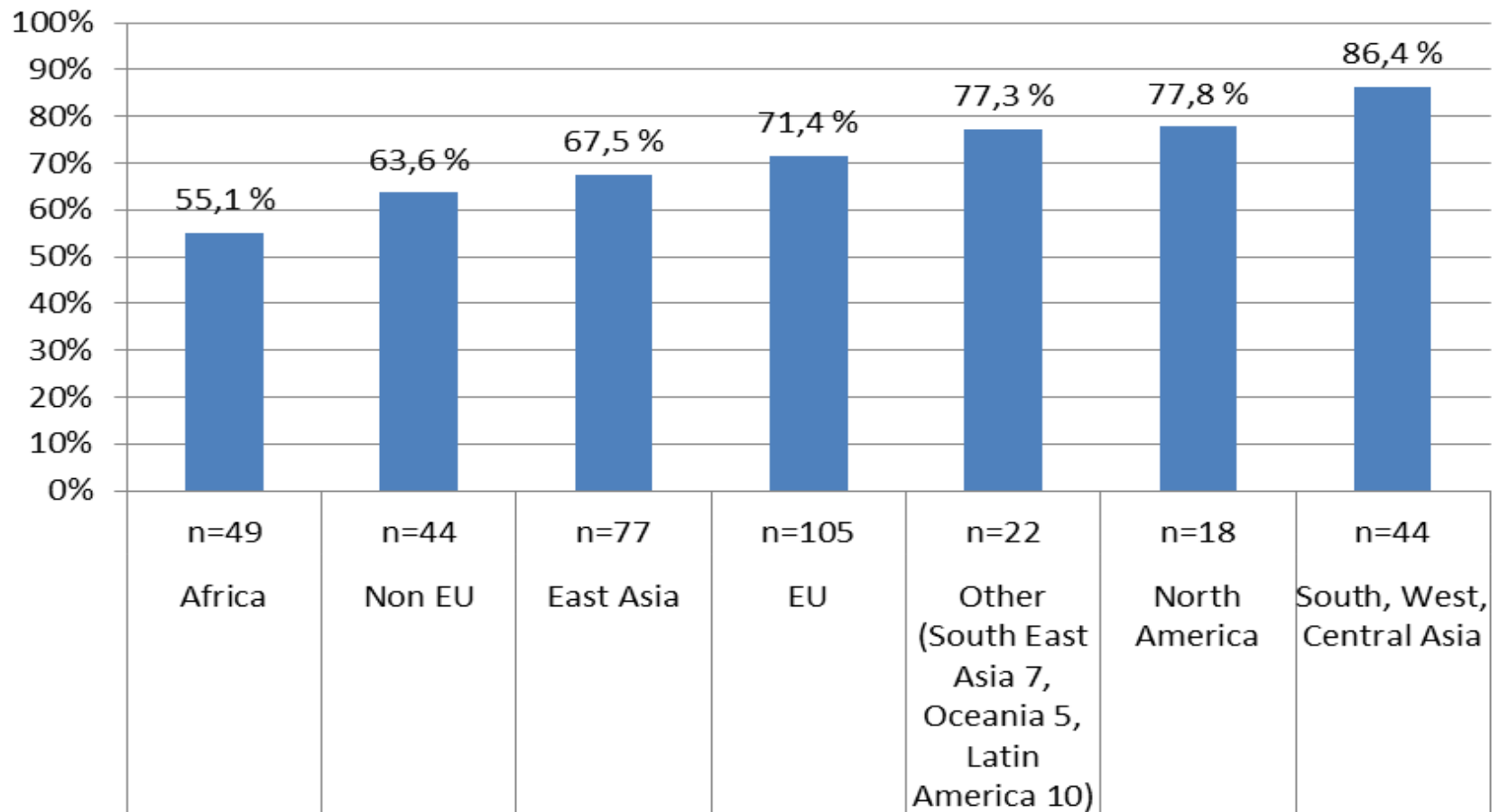
Primary occupation by continent of birth, English-language degree programmes, UAS
