Special Initiative / Partnerships for Prospects (P4P)

2014: Special initiative (SI) "Tackling the root causes of displacement, (re-)integrating refugees" was **launched** to enable BMZ to **respond in a targeted yet flexible manner to global refugee movements**

SI has **supported more than 260 projects in 68 countries** in various sectors such as health, employment promotion, education, infrastructure, MHPSS and social protection

2016: International Conference "Supporting Syria and the Region", launch of the Partnership for Prospects Initiative

Aim: improve living conditions of refugees, IDPs and vulnerable populations in host communities in the countries most affected by the Syrian crisis through short-term employment.

Focus and Mode of Operation P4P

- ➔ Overall Objectives: „jobs for adults – training for young people – schooling for children“
- ➔ Types of projects: **Cash for Work, CfW+, financing salaries**
- ➔ 30 projects in **Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria** and **Turkey**
- ➔ Implementers:
 - **KfW** (mostly through UN Organisations and INGOs), **GIZ, INGOs** (e.g. Save the Children, Caritas, Kindernothilfe, IRC, DRC), **Local NGOs**
- ➔ Basic Principles:
 - **In line with government policies**
 - **Beyond humanitarian assistance**
 - **„Do-no-harm“**
 - **Include specific target groups: women, youth**



Succes Factors of P4P

- Independent from funding cycles and procedures – **separate budget line**;
- Use of replenishments and follow-up phases to **build on grown structures and reduce the administrative burden**;
- **Range of implementing partners**, each with their own specific comparative advantages;
- **Flexibility in terms of content:** (infrastructure) **measures** can be supported according to the specific context and needs of host communities and target groups;
- **Possibility to redirect funds at short notice** when needs have changed.

2021: Achieved Results

- **98,300 job opportunities** were created
 - **446,500 family members** benefited
 -  **550,000 refugee children** attended school
 -  **24,000 beneficiaries** received trainings
 -  **634,000 beneficiaries** received medical care
 -  **2218 apartments** were renovated
 -  **more than 300 km in streets** were rehabilitated
 -  **204 public green spaces** were upvalued and more than **10,000 trees** were planted
 -  **15,000 beneficiaries** were placed in the primary job market and start-ups were registered

Evaluation of the P4P in 2021

- The P4P initiative was evaluated in the period **from 2016 to 2019** by the German Institute for Development Evaluation.
- **Findings, lessons learned and take aways:**
 - **„Integrated approach“**: inclusion of the host community and **cooperation with local authorities** and existing structures
 - Positive effects of **short-term cfw measures / temporary relief** from hardship
 - Balance between **short term and long term jobs**
 - **Complementary use of training and upskilling measures** in addition to short-term cfw work measures offers long-term perspectives for beneficiaries
 - Positive effects on **social cohesion**
 - Positive effects on the **inclusion of women** into the labor force - increase **focus on women's participation** in our projects

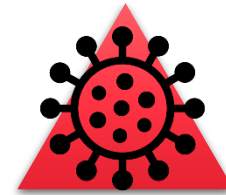

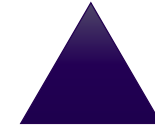
